RETHINKING HOSPITALS

At the same time we are facing tremendous social challenges such as demographic change, staff shortage and climate change.

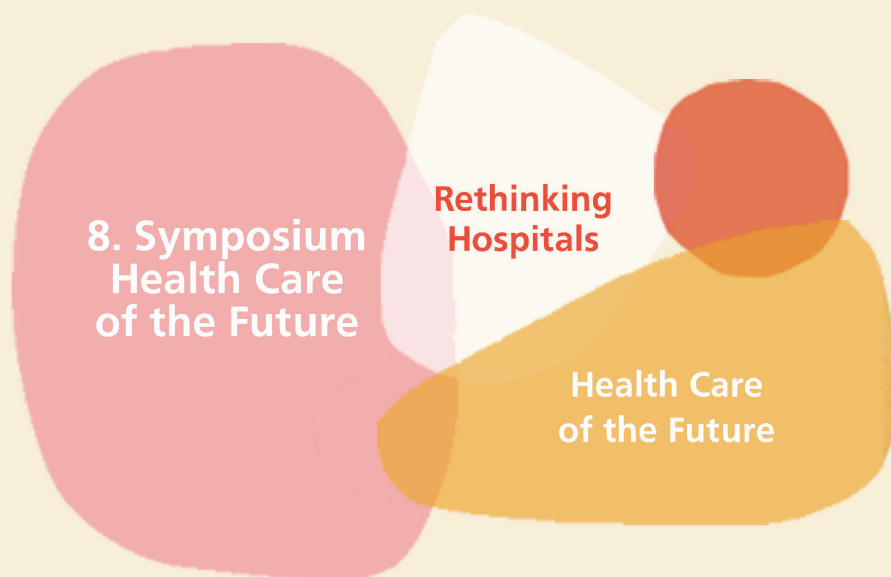
Due to these challenges healthcare infrastructure will have to change fundamentally to continuously ensure sustainable and equitable care. "Continuum of care" is the key word that will accompany the healthcare system's shift from a fragmented and inflated chaos towards an efficient network of healthcare services.

Which consequences will this imply for the hospital of the future? Will there still be the general hospital as we know it? Which new, alternative concepts would be conceivable? How do we adapt the existing building stock? Does the hospital of the future have to be mobile, modular and flexible? And how can we ensure human-centred and sustainable care in these new efficient buildings?
